
The Pupil Council are looking forward to their summer holidays, but we will be looking for new members for next year. Are you interested? Keep an eye on Google Classroom for more information in August!

Raspberry Sorbet

Ingredients:

- 130g Sugar
- ¼ tsp Lemon Juice
- 200g Raspberries



Heat the sugar, lemon juice and 1 cup of water in a small saucepan for 4 minutes or until dissolved.

Blend the raspberries in a blender or by mashing with the back of a spoon, add the syrup and process until blended.

Pass through a sieve to remove the seeds.

Pour into a plastic freezer box, cover and freeze. Stir every 30 minutes with a whisk during freezing to break up the ice crystals and give a better texture. Keep in the freezer until ready to serve.

The Silver group will go out on their practice expedition at the end of May in the Cairngorms and then at the end of September for qualifying.



Euros 2024: Let the games begin!

The season may be over, but the footballers haven't got a break yet. Because this summer, The Euros are back, this time in Germany, so let's look at what could occur in this summer's edition.

Will Italy retain their title?

After lockdown struck in 2020, the Euros was postponed until 2021 where Italy and England reached the final, and after a tense game which ended 1-1 and went to penalties, it was the Italians who triumphed with goalkeeper Gianluigi Donnaruma making the decisive save up against a young Bukayo Saka. But in a group with Spain, Croatia, and Albania, Italy could be in danger. Spain have defeated Croatia 3-0 in their group opener sending warning signs to all, whereas Italy less convincingly beat Albania 2-1, where Albania scored the fastest goal in the Euros after 23 seconds. But Italy remains one of the favourites, but still faces competition.

Southgate's last dance?

After the heartbreak of losing the Euros on their own turf, England will be wanting to recover and get back to that stage, looking stronger than last time with the likes of Bellingham, Foden, Kane and Saka thriving this season, they could be in with a chance. However they are under immense pressure as manager Gareth Southgate has revealed he could leave if they don't win, leaving England with a big question. Who is next?

Who are the dark horses?

There are plenty of teams nobody expects to make it out the group, but some people have got believe in others, teams such as Scotland, Croatia, Denmark and even Portugal are expected to be underdogs, Portugal will want to send off their legendary striker Cristiano Ronaldo as he is now 39 and expected to be leaving soon. Scotland, in a group with Germany, Hungary and Switzerland, were thrashed in the first game of the tournament against Germany 5-1 with their only goal being an own goal by Antonio Rudiger, Croatia, as I mentioned

previously, are with Spain, Italy and Albania and have started sluggishly with a 3-0 defeat, and Denmark with England, Slovenia and Serbia.

Who are the players who could shine?

There are many star players on each time, Van Dijk for Netherlands, Mbappé for France, Bellingham for England, Musiala for Germany, but some teams like this have one star player and not much else, for example Poland and Robert Lewandowski, Georgia and Kvicha Kvaratskhelia, Scotland and Andrew Robertson, all of these teams will be relying on these players to do a masterclass.

My predictions for the tournament

Winners: France

They have talent in every department on the pitch, Maignan in goals, Saliba in defence, Griezmann in midfield, Mbappé in attack, and with youngsters like Warren Zaire-Emery rising up it wouldn't be a surprise if France lifted the trophy at the end.

Runners up: Germany

As much as I want to say England I just feel Germany have a better chance of making it to the final, however I believe they don't have enough experience and form to have a chance against France, even with players like Wirtz, Musiala and Havertz developing impressively I just feel France are stronger.

Golden Boot: Mbappe and Kane

I had it between these two but I believe they are both as good as each other, Kane has experience, Mbappé has talent. Both cancel each other out and will draw for the top scorer trophy.

Underdog: Denmark

Scotland could do something but I believe maximum is Quarter finals, Denmark on the other hand reached the semis last time and I believe could do it again, they have more talent and more experienced players and could produce a masterclass.

Scotland and England begin their campaigns

The Euro 2024 is underway and the two UK competitors, Scotland and England, have both begun their charges with mixed results. Here's a report of what went down.

Scotland open the tournament with a whimper

After a brilliant run of form including the beating of Spain during qualification, Scotland were looking to have a big start as they aim to get out of the Euros group stage for the first time, however the plan didn't start well as they played host nation Germany in the tournament opener. And rather than fighting for a draw, Scotland were slapped with a 5-1 thrashing with the only goal being scored for them was an own goal. Scotland started weakly as within 10 minutes Germany had scored after a curling outside of the box shot from German midfielder Florian Wirtz was met with a weak hand by Scottish keeper Angus Gunn making it 1-0, and then another 10 minutes went by before star midfielder Jamal Musiala rifled a shot past Gunn making it 2-0. And then Scotland shot themselves in the foot, after a German attack was being defended, Ilkay Gundogan rushed in but was clattered dangerously by Scottish defender Ryan Porteus with studs up and on the ankle resulting in a penalty and red card, Kai Havertz fired the penalty home to make it 3-0 and give Scotland little chance.

Then after a quick start to the second half German Striker Niclas Fullkrug struck a thunderbolt of a half volley to give Germany a 4-0 advantage, Scotland did have something to smile about as Antonio Rudiger flicked the ball past his keeper Manuel Neuer to make it 4-1 but Emre Can cancelled that out with an outside of the box curler to make it 5-1 making it the highest scoring opening Euros 2024 game. A depressing start for Scotland but it's not over yet.

England start nervously confident

After seeing their noisy neighbour get loudly silenced England began their account against Serbia hoping to start strongly, and they did with a 13th minute opener by 20 year old wonderkid Jude Bellingham, making him just the second



English player to score in both the Euros and World cup before turning 21 since Michael Owen. But after about 30 minutes they quietened down, with Kyle Walker turning it past the goal, then they began defence practice, a cross was turned away shakily by John Stones, but they survived a first half storm and prepared for a second half tsunami. Serbia had a few promising attacks with the best coming from Dusan Vlahovic which was parried over the bar acrobatically by Jordan Pickford. But the biggest chance fell to England when a cross whipped in by Jarrod Bowen was headed by Harry Kane but saved onto the bar by Predrag Rajkovic, but England held on to start their Euro campaign strongly.

Film Review in Spanish: Los Diarios de Motocicleta



West Side Story- Remake Review

West Side Story is a fantastic movie taking inspiration from the Shakespeare play "Romeo and Juliet" but instead set in the slums of New York. The original movie was released in 1961, but the exciting, colourful new remake came out in 2021 with music from Leonard Bernstein, directed by Stephen Spielberg. The remake adds even more to the movie, without taking any away from the original. When a movie is remade, sometimes it can be hard to live up to expectations or to stay true to the original film, however I think the 2021 West Side Story does that and more.

It further develops character relationships such as Rita Moreno; the original Anita in the 1961 original, plays a brand new character named Valentina who runs Doc's Drugstore, and plays an important role in the relationship she has with Tony. Valentina is his boss but also almost like a mother figure to him; which is really nice to watch and brings a whole new dimension to the film. There is also more character psychology, which provides an insight into why some characters acted the way they did, and

their motivations for doing so. Such as Riff's backstory, when it becomes clear that he is haunted by a previous act of violence he has committed, and that he has spent some time in jail. The new dimensions the movie brought to these characters emphasises how this is not the life Riff and Tony want to lead, the faith Valentina had in them, and ultimately makes the ending even more tragic.

As the movie is a remake modern changes were made and it was adapted for a 2024 audience, such as cultural authenticity as the movie added more unsubtitled Spanish conversations between the Sharks which made it much more authentic and representative.

Production values were also excellent as there was an array of even more flamboyant and colourful costumes, which is especially noticeable in the ensemble number "America".


However, the movie is not all light and cheery, "Romeo and Juliet' obviously being a tragedy.

The song "Somewhere" sung by Rita Moreno is absolutely heartbreaking. It has such an overall message of hope which makes the death scene between Maria and Tony even more devastating and poignant. Overall I think the movie was excellently done, and I think the newly added details made the story even more compelling, without taking anything away from the original and is one of my favourite films today. Even if you didn't see the original, the modern take on "Romeo and Juliet" is for everyone and is a must see.
