The National Picture

 Schools presented Nationals for the first time in May-June 2014

 Full course outlines, specifications & assessment arrangements, including specimen papers, past papers and marking schemes are available and complete (SQA Website)

The Wallace Picture

- Our first four years of presenting Nationals have resulted in strong attainment
- Current S4 pupils have selected up to *seven* Nationals and started these in May 2017
- In common with Standard Grade, absolutely final decisions about level of presentation will not be made until *Post-Prelim*
- This ensures maximum time for pupils to progress and perform at the *highest level possible*
- On-going feedback about levels will be provided through: Tracking Report (19th Oct & 7th Feb); Parents' Evenings (6th Sep and 23rd Jan); and all usual Pupil Support and Faculty communications (letters, phone calls, meetings)

Different Levels: National 4 or 5?

- All units and courses from Nat 1–4 are internally assessed by teachers and moderated by the SQA
- The Added Value Unit at Nat 4 replaces an examination with a project-based assessment
- For Nat 5 and above there will be a final examination (exactly like the previous Intermediate and Higher structure)
- At Nat 5, from this session, pupils will no longer have to complete unit passes as part of their award. Units are available as a stand-alone option.
- Courses from Nat 1 4 are simply graded pass or fail
- Courses at Nat 5 are graded A-D or 'No Award'
- From this session, D at Nat 5 will be 40%-49%; previously 45%

Recognising Positive Achievement

- Previously, if you achieved all units at Nat 5 and completed the Nat 4 Added Value Unit, you could be awarded a compensatory Nat 4 award if you got a 'No Award'
- Positive presentation still exists for this interim year, even though units are gone - only possible if students complete units in addition to the course
- This supports *positive presentation at Nat 5* where a student has an *evidence-based* chance of passing and has completed the additional internal units

Prelims & SQA Results Service

- Prelims are designed to provide a formative experience of exam conditions before the final exam
- Changes to SQA protocols put a different emphasis on Prelims as we no longer submit Prelim evidence for the SQA Results Service
- From 2013/14 SQA 'Appeals' have been revised as follows:
- **1.** <u>Exceptional Circumstances Consideration</u> evidence submitted due to illness; family circumstances etc. immediately after exam
- 2. <u>**Results Service**</u> administrative check or re-mark.

Grades can go *up or down* with either check

Evidence no longer submitted to support such appeals
