

You have had **lots of feedback** on this in your four/five years in school to date and so you should have a good idea of your **strongest areas** and those that you, broadly, wish to continue to study.



#### CYBER SECURITY

#### Level 5 National Progression Award

#### Purpose

The NPA in Cyber Security is designed to give students both theoretical knowledge and practical skills in the vitally important area of Cyber Security. As cybercrime becomes an increasing threat in modern business and personal internet use, demand for skills in this area is very high. Employment opportunities exist in both public and private sectors including Law Enforcement.

As the course develops a high degree of awareness of cyber threats is it also suited to any pupil who wishes to help protect themselves, their friends and their families from online crime.

The overarching aim of the award is to improve the skills pipeline in cyber security so that more young people consider a career in this area of skills shortage.

#### Recommended Entry

An interest in technology, crime & law and computer security issues.

Pupils will be required to sign up to a code of conduct given the nature of the skills being taught.

#### Course Construction

The course has three areas of study:

#### Data Security

Pupils will learn about the legal and ethical obligations around storing and sharing personal and business data. They are expected to explain the causes and effects of security breaches and learn skills to protect data against security breaches.

#### Digital Forensics

Pupils will gain an insight into the digital forensics process as used by law enforcement for investigating cybercrime. They will learn to apply relevant techniques in acquiring data and how to preserve and examine digital evidence.

#### Ethical Hacking

Pupils will learn about current tools and techniques used by ethical and malicious hackers to compromise computer systems. They must understand current legislation relating to computer crime and hacking. They will also learn to perform a routine penetration test on a computer system within a controlled environment.

#### Assessment

Internally assessed. Pupils will be expected to complete a number of theoretical and practical tests in each unit.

#### Homework

This will consist of reading course material and completing written assignments reinforcing new topics.

#### S5 Course Choice 2021

Course Choice 2021-2022 - Current S4 making choices for S5

In February, all pupils in S4 will choose the subjects that they would like to study in S5.

Pupils must choose their subjects and submit their choices via the Google Form sent to their school email address by Friday 26 February 2021. Courses are offered subject to staff availability and to sufficient numbers opting for each course.

Pupils have a personal choice of the five subjects they wish to study. However, we generally recommend that pupils choose progression from the subjects studied in S4. The decision to 'pick up' or 'crash' a subject should only be taken where there is clear evidence that pupils' prior skills development and interests would lead to success. Remember that the majority of pupils stay on at school for S5 and S6, so course choice decisions should reflect this. Every attempt will be made to satisfy the first choices, or the alternative choice as necessary.

The level at which the subject will be studied depends on a pupil gaining the necessary grades to allow entry into the course. There is no need to indicate the level of study as this will be recommended by class teachers and Faculty Leaders based on prior attainment. The following subjects are offered in SS:

## **S5 & S6 OPTIONS S5 2023/24**

5 full subject courses (includes personalised arrangements - college etc.)

<u>S6 2023/24</u>

Minimum 4 core options (includes Sports Leader, Community Awards, Peer Support, agreed personalised work experience etc.) + 1 column of structured study



- We attempt to provide an **'open' choice** to ensure that we maximise choice of subjects that will lead to success.
- S4/5 Pupil Support/Careers interviews have included conversations to support the *BEST* choices being made and a parental/pupil meeting (in-person or via Google Meet) can be requested.
- Even if pupils and parents feel they do not require an additional meeting following completing the online form, all forms will be reviewed by the Pupil Support Team and we will discuss any issues that arise with the individual pupil (ensuring that we have considered, collectively, the *best* options for your child).
- Where **staffing/demand limits a choice** in any subject we will discuss this and seek to ensure there is a **good alternative choice** or that this can be planned over S5/6.
- Advanced Higher period allocation and range of subjects that we offer depends on uptake.


# WHAT CHOICES?

- Depends on performance in prior stages!

- Are any subjects *required* for your chosen career?
- Advice from: Pupil Support Leader/ Subject Specialists/ Careers (SDS)/ My World of Work...don't be afraid to ask your teachers lots of questions about this...

### UNIVERSITY & UCAS EXPECTATIONS

- For all students Highers are your main entry qualifications but be aware of core National 5 minimum expectations - especially in English and Maths.
- S6: be aware of the number of universities (Edinburgh etc.) that set requirements to complete courses even with an unconditional offer.
- UCAS now writes to schools stating they must be informed if students drop a subject so please take subjects you will sustain.
