CAREER PATHWAYS

There is a variety of different pathways available to pupils at Wallace High School. These are: progression into Apprenticeships, College, Employment and University.

COURSE CHOICE

You must research the pathway that you want to achieve and plan how to get there, for example what subjects do you need to pass and what grade do you require to gain the correct pathway.

SELECTION OF SUBJECTS

You should ensure you are selecting the relevant subjects and levels that you require to meet your needs.

UNIVERSITY

Research the Universities and courses that interest you. Find out the entry requirements, and ensure you are aware of the course content.

University and Graduate Apprenticeships - most courses require 4/5 Highers at A and B grades. Some courses require Advanced Highers. Some will also require National 5s, often in English and Maths, even if they are not essential at Higher level.

PERSONAL <u>STA</u>TEMENT

REFERENCE

Select a UCAS mentor that knows you well and has a good knowledge of the subject specific course you wish to apply to.

PERSONAL STATEMENT

Similar to your CV, include any awards, extra curricular activities, course specific information and skills and qualities.

WORK EXPERIENCE

It is recommended that you complete a work experience placement that relates to your chosen course choice as this strengthens your application and it also gives you more information for your personal statement.

FURTHER EDUCATION COLLEGE

Research the courses available and look at the progression onto University, Apprenticeship or employment.

NC College Courses - generally National 4 and National 5s for entry, although some courses do not require specific qualifications.

HNC/HND College Courses - generally 2 Highers at C grade plus National 5s for entry.

An apprenticeship is a great combination of further education and employment. There are three different types of apprenticeship -

- 1. Foundation Apprenticeship study at college while you are still at school.
- 2. Modern Apprenticeship Full time employment and further education at training provider.
- 3.Graduate Apprenticeship Higher Education at University and employment.

APPLICATION

COVER LETTER

A letter to a company introducing yourself.

CV

Your CV should include detailed information about your skills and qualities, qualifications, work experience and why they should select you.

WORK EXPERIENCE

Work experience is very important as it gives you an experience of the industry that you are applying for. It also gives you the opportunity to talk about this in some detail in your interview.

INTERVIEW

This is where you should be prepared to talk about the company that you are applying to, your skills, qualities and experiences, and why **you** should be the successful candidate.
